**Additional Container Needed**

Overloaded containers will result in waste spilled onto the ground when automated loader attempts to deposit into truck. In this case a 3<sup>rd</sup> container is needed to contain the excess refuse.

We recommend that you place your containers near the edge of the roadway the *evening before* pick up.

You may place one large item out per week. If you need to arrange for more to be picked up, or have something as large as a king-size mattress, please call Republic Services in advance at (219) 921-1294.
